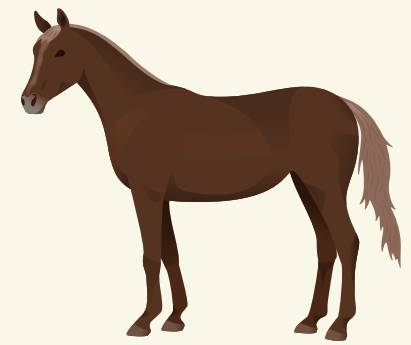

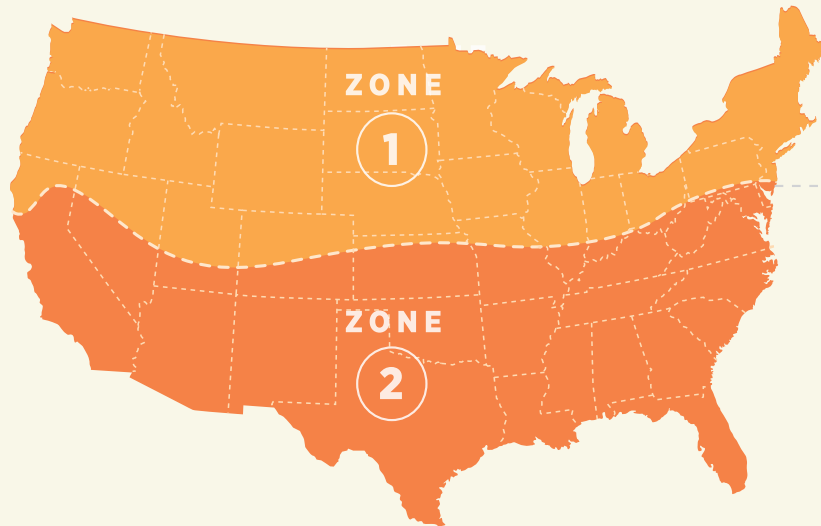
1- to 2 Year Olds

YOUNG HORSES ARE MORE SUSCEPTIBLE TO PARASITES

According to the current American Association of Equine Practitioners (AAEP) guidelines, horses between 1 and 2 years of age require special attention as they are at higher risk for developing disease from parasite infection. That's why experts recommend 3 to 4 yearly treatments for horses in this age group.

WHEN DO I DEWORM MY 1- to 2-YEAR-OLD HORSE?

It depends on the length of your grazing season. Find your zone on the map below to help determine the best timing.¹
